This park has national significance for its ecological diversity and Aboriginal and World War II history. It also protects part of the Port Darwin wetland. The park has 36 of the NT's 51 mangrove species. Historic sites are scattered through the park. There's a World War II display where you can learn about Darwin's role in the Pacific War. Shell middens suggest the Larrakia people have used this land for many thousands of years.
